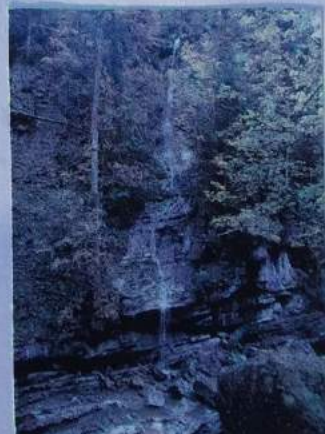
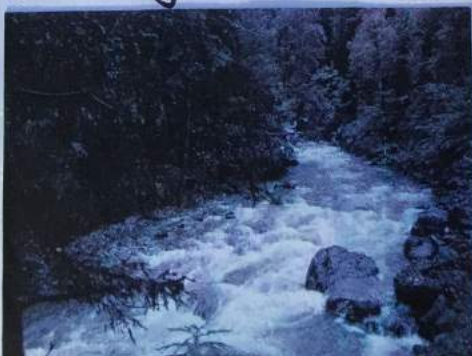

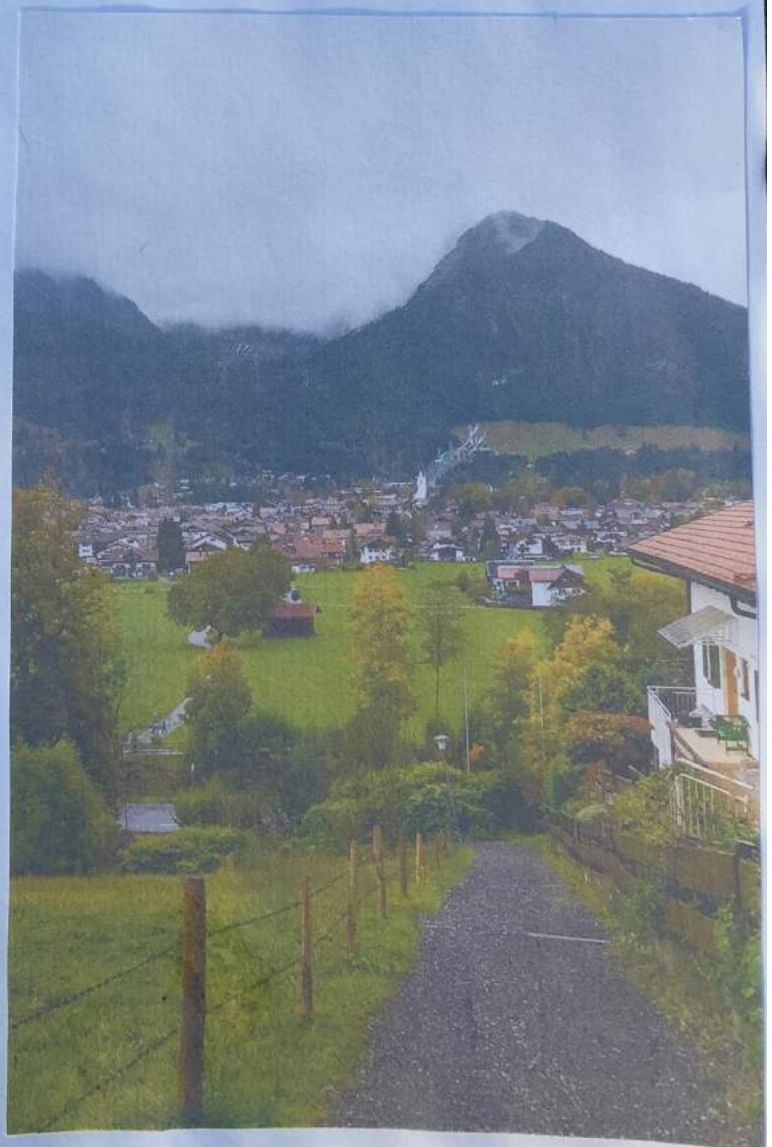
Breitachklamm

Heini Klopfer Skiflugschanze

On Thursday the 8th of October we went to the Heini Klopfer Skiflugschanze.

We had a guide who showed us around.

The Skiflugschanze was built in 1949 by Heini Klopfer. He was the first ski jumper in February 1950 and he jumped 90m. The record today is 238 meters but this was jumped on the new jump. In 2016 the big renovation started. In February 2017 it was reopened. The skijumptower is now 72 meters high and we had a great view from the top. We couldn't imagine to jump from there.
